Pizza robberies investigation ongoing

On the evenings of October 26, 2017 and November 1, 2017 four males ordered pizza from an unregistered phone to be delivered to the back door of two different apartment buildings around Bodmin Road and Truscott Drive. Upon both deliveries four males in hoodies robbed the drivers.

The delivery drivers were from different pizza establishments.

There have been no further incidents since November 1, 2017 in the Park Royal area. The same four males—with the same objective to rob the delivery driver—perpetrated both robberies at the two different apartment buildings.

This investigation by the Peel Regional Police is still ongoing and they are still looking for anonymous tips from local residents through Crime Stoppers at 1-800-222-TIPS. According to Peel Regional Police, unless you are a pizza delivery driver, the general public is not at risk.



Community Crime Meeting

About 35 residents from various communities within Clarkson attended a community crime meeting on January 23, 2018 at Clarkson Secondary School. Residents had an opportunity to interact with Peel Police, Councillor Karen Ras, Safe City Mississauga, Peel Crime Stoppers and the City of Mississauga Property department.

Constable Amy Boudreau started her presentation with a statistic that there were 2211 break-ins in Mississauga, Brampton and Caledon in 2016. She continued that only a small amount of burglaries occur at night and instead most occur between 9 am and 11 am in the morning and in the mid-afternoon.

Break-ins occur 54% of the time through the front door with 12% occurring through windows. The first places they head is to the bedroom for valuables and living room for electronics. Homes with blocked sight lines to the front door and windows, over grown landscaping, high bushes and private fences are ideal targets for burglars.

“Always report something,” recommends Constable Boudreau, “if you see something suspicious, it probably is.”

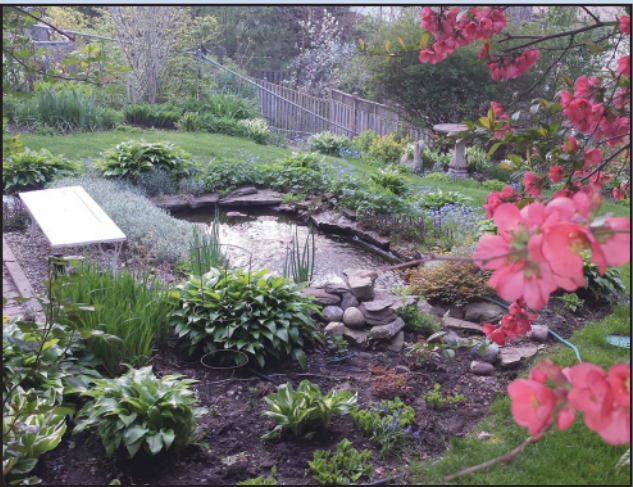
You can report suspicious incidents to Peel Regional Police or anonymously through Crime Stoppers at 1-800-222-TIPS.

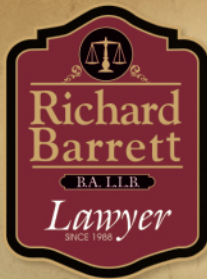

Park Royal Community Association organizing community-wide event for June 16, 2018



The Park Royal Community Association has one ambition with our annual yard sale: to make it the biggest yard sale in Mississauga.

In our December 2017 newsletter we announced that we were planning to turn our annual event held outside the Park Royal Bible Church into a community-wide event designed to lure people from around Mississauga and the Greater Toronto Area to Park Royal.

Since making this announcement in December

we have received tremendous response from members of the community excited to participate. We also have received many inquiries from businesses and other community groups wanting to participate.

We have selected Saturday, June 16, 2018 to be the date for the Park Royal community-wide yard sale. The epicenter of the sale will again be the Park Royal Bible Church however there may be many hubs of bargain hunting activity.

There will be featured sales tables at the Park Royal Bible Church and the pricing to participate will remain the same. Members will be able to rent a table for \$15 and it will be \$20 for non-members. Parking will be available across the street at the Park Royal Plaza and along side streets off of Truscott Drive.

Residents and businesses throughout Park Royal are encouraged to also participate either by renting a table or by setting up their own yard sale on their property. If you are using your own property or premise there is no charge to participate. We encourage you to contact us at yardsale@parkroyalca.org to let us know that you will participate as we will include you in our

map/guide that will be made available to all visitors.

All participants will be included in our map/guide at no cost, however members of the Park Royal Community Association will receive an enhanced listing that will detail the types of items for sale. Watermain replacements in Park Royal continues

The Region of Peel starts new phases of project this spring concluding in fall 2019

The Region of Peel is continuing the replacement of watermains, water services and fire hydrants throughout Park Royal. The Region is also installing new transmission watermains to enhance the water supply to the South West Mississauga water system.

Residents should continue to expect traffic disruptions, lane closures and reduced on-street parking while the watermain construction work progresses. Once the work has been completed all streets will be paved and any disturbed areas will be restored.

Assignment A (13-1347 A) includes watermain installation on Benedet Drive, Birch and Poplar Crescents, Vey Road, Tredmore Drive, Harman and Selord Courts and Playford Road. Work on this assignment is essentially completed with the exception of some minor deficiencies and sod that will be laid in the spring.

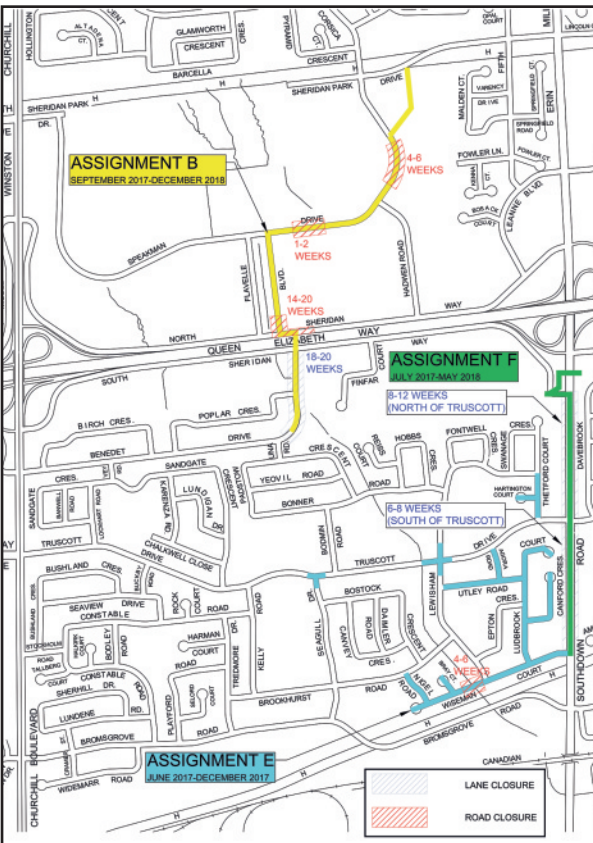
Assignment B (13-1347 B) is in the industrial park northwest of Erin Mills Parkway and the QEW. This work will include a tunnel crossing of the QEW and tunnelling work on Benedet Drive. The anticipated construction timeline is from late this spring to the fall of 2019. North Sheridan Way

will be closed and Benedet Drive will be reduced to one lane for southbound traffic for approximately five to six months.

Assignment C (13-1347 C) is along the multi-use trail in Kodgadywin Park between Benedet Drive and Southdown Road. This construction will start in this spring and be complete by next summer, 2019. The multi-use trail will be temporarily closed for the duration of construction.

Assignment E (17-13915 C) includes watermain construction on Wiseman, Ludbrook, Bray, Thetford and Hartington Courts, Nigel, Utley and Agora Roads, and Canford Crescent. It will also include a pressure zone boundary adjustment which will give a pressure increase for area residents. Construction of this project began in September 2017 and is ongoing and is anticipated to be completed by this spring, weather permitting, for laying sod and road paving.

Assignment F (17-13915 A) includes watermain construction along Southdown Road from South Sheridan Way to Wiseman Court. Construction recently began in January and will be complete this fall. Lane reductions on Southdown Road will cause some disruptions to traffic.



Ongoing water infrastructure updates should reduce repairs and increase water pressure.
