Willow Glen Public School demolition

The demolition of Willow Glen Public School occurred in November. The site has not been graded or sodded which was a requirement of the Peel District School Board before closing the Agreement to Purchase and Sale to the Clty of Mississauga.

The closing of this agreement has been delayed until the end of May when the final sodding and grading will be completed.

A public information session will be held this spring by Councillor Karen Ras to provide an update regarding city plans for park development on site.

1516 and 1526 Southdown Road

On January 16, 2017 the Planning and Development Committee of the City of Mississauga approved the rezoning and official plan amendment application to construct a two-storey office building.

The next step is for the applicant to go through the site plan process to work out the building design and then to submit a building permit.

2210 and 2230 Bromsgrove Road

The City of Mississauga is processing applications to redevelop 2210 and 2230 Bromsgrove Road with 104 back-to-back townhouses on a private condominium road. Comments have been provided to the applicant based on their previous resubmission. The City of Mississauga is currently awaiting a resubmission that addresses those comments.

If the resubmission addresses all outstanding requirements the next step would be a recommendation report to put before the City's Planning and Development Committee. The applicant has also made a resubmission of the applications including updated drawings and reports to address the comments.

The City of Mississauga has received new Official Plan Amendment and Rezoning applications for the property at 2200 Bromsgrove Road. The plan is to build 84 back-to-back three-storey stacked townhouses. This property is immediately east of the 104 townhouse development proposed by a different applicant and owner.





Coyotes in Park Royal

Do you know what to do if you encounter a coyote?



There have been many coyote sightings in the Park Royal area recently. January through March is coyote breeding season, so there is heightened activity during this time.

To date, coyotes have not posed a human safety risk, however they can prey upon pets if they are

walked off leash, left outdoors or unattended. It is always wise to exercise caution around wildlife. There is information and tips available at www.parkroyalca.org.

Animal Control encourages people to report sightings to 311 or (905) 615-4311. They keep track of where the coyotes are living and visit the location to check on the animal.

Here are some tips if you encounter a coyote:

- stay calm and wait until it moves away.
- do not turn your back or run (like a dog, this may cause it to chase you).
- if you are approached, stand tall, wave your arms, make yourself as large as possible.
- clap, yell, shout loudly, throw something or make startling movements (coyotes avoid scary situations).
- carry a flash light, audible alarm or an umbrella you can open to startle it.
- carry a cell phone.

The Big Springtime Purge

Lessons learned from a new addition to the Park Royal community

After living in our home in Clarkson Village for 15 years, we moved to Park Royal last July. As with any move it was a great opportunity to purge and reduce what we had in our home.

We started the big purge seven months ahead of the big move—I was off work after a company restructuring and had a lot of time to get the ball rolling.

We looked in every room, cupboard, drawer, the garage and backyard, to determine what would stay and what would go. So whether you are looking to make a move like we did or are looking to free up room with some spring cleaning, this is what we did:

- We used the garage as the gathering place for items leaving the home (if you don't have a garage, devise a purging system that works best for you).
- Salvation Army offers free pick-up for furniture. We donated various pieces of gently used furniture (they pick up at your office too). Call (905) 270-6275 to arrange pick-up.
- We took garbage bags of clothes to used clothing donation boxes and we took many carloads of items to the Salvation Army Thrift Store Donor Centre and Value Village.
- We gave items to family and friends, and put items at the curb—one man's trash is another man's treasure...
- Check for waste exemption periods on your

- scheduled garbage days and take advantage of the no maximum amount of acceptable garbage collection days. Tuesday, May 23, 2017 will be the next garbage exemption day in Park Royal; there will be another day on Monday, September 11, 2017.
- We took our half-empty paint cans, household hazardous waste and recycling items to the Battleford Community Recycling Centre (the Salvation Army Thrift Store Donor Centre is also located there). There are often one special hazardous collection day a year put on by the Region of Peel either in Park Royal or close by.
- We rented a dumpster bin and continued to throw away larger items from the house, garage and backyard.
